Discover the heart of Italy with this **Italian Cultural Society Tutta Toscana** exclusive tour. This tour highlights the romantic, legendary region of Tuscany with a peek into the Liguria region with a full day excursion to the fabulous Cinque Terre. These areas are brimming with the finest Italian art, history, culture, scenic natural beauty and culinary delights.

In Tuscany travelers will discover **Florence**, known as the "**cradle of the Renaissance**" (la culla del Rinascimento) for its monuments, churches, and buildings. The best-known site in Florence is the domed cathedral of the city, Santa Maria del Fiore, known as *Il Duomo*, designed by Filippo

Brunelleschi. Florence is a living museum, and just one of the many spectacular cities you will explore on our "Tutta Toscana" adventure! Tuscany is also Pisa, with its famous leaning tower and the Piazza of Miracles.

Tuscany is Siena, with its stunning Piazza del Campo, where each July 2 and August 16, the breathtaking "Palio delle Contrade" the world's most exciting horse race takes place.

Tuscany is a land of lush olive groves, sweet hillsides, Chianti vineyards, and romantic hamlets. Tuscany is the wonderful walled city of Lucca, nicknamed the city of "one hundred churches". Lucca is a magnificent walled city and the birthplace of famed Italian Opera composer Giacomo Puccini, who wrote "La Boheme," "Madame Butterfly," and "Tosca". We will experience Puccini's music with a live concert in his hometown! Tuscany is the seaside resort city of Viareggio known for its Carnival, its beaches and its glamorous nightclubs. Tuscany is the majestic, white marble mountains of Carrara where the world's most beautiful marble is harvested.

Our Tuscan Treasures Tour will take you to the rich Etruscan city of Volterra, famous for its beautiful alabaster, and to picturesque San Gimignano with magnificent towers built in the Middle Ages and cobblestone streets lined with wonderful shops. We will wine taste on the legendary Chianti wine road and visit the town of Leonardo da Vinci. In Vinci we will visit Leonardo's Museum and his home, as well as enjoy a homemade lunch on a hillside wine and olive oil estate. All the splendor and beauty, which have brought travelers to Tuscany for hundreds of years, await you on our exciting Tuscan Treasures Tour.

Italy counts a total of 61 UNESCO World Heritage Sites within its borders, the Highest number of any other country in the world. (China, which is 32 times larger than Italy, is in second place with 59!) WE WILL VISIT AN UNBELIEVABLE 6+ WORLD HERITAGE SITES! The historical center of Florence, Piazza del Duomo in Pisa, San Gimignano, Siena, Portovenere and Le Cinque Terre. In addition, Italy is the only country in the world whose food is considered as an Intangible Cultural Heritage of Humanity. The Incredible 4.2-kilometer Wall of Lucca is currently on the "tentative" list. A UNESCO World Heritage Site is a place that is listed by the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organization (UNESCO) as having special cultural or physical significance.

Departure You will depart US for your flight to Florence, Italy. Italy is 9 hours ahead of California time so you must plan to arrive in Florence, Italy by June 5, 2026. We can assist you with your flight arrangements or you may book on your own.



TOUR ITINERARY:

Day 1: June 5, 2026, Arrival: Tour begins today; those arriving at Florence Airport will enjoy private airport pick up and transportation to our Villa hotel with portage service. Our home is the historic **Villa delle Rose**, where you will be staying for the next 9 nights. Hotel Villa delle Rose is in Pescia, a wonderful area at the foot of the Abetone Mountains, alongside the Pescia River. Enjoy welcome cocktail party and group orientation before a delicious multi course dinner at the hotel. **Welcome to Italy!**

Day 2: June 6, 2026, Lucca: Full day excursion to Lucca, once the capital city of Tuscany and the most important city in Tuscany during Roman times, Lucca remains a city of great charm and beauty. After your buffet breakfast, depart by private motor coach for this Tuscan jewel: the walled city of Lucca.

Meet our private city guide for a half-day walking tour of Lucca including the famous walls which enclose this charming city. Visit the church and Piazza of San Martino which houses Lucca's most famous and beautiful art pieces: "il Volto Santo" the incredible wood carved crucifix and the white marble sarcophagus of 'Ilaira del Carretto". See the lovely San Frediano church with its mosaic front, the beautiful facade and square of San Michele Church which is located in what was the Roman forum, see the home of Giacomo Puccini, and stroll the city's most famous street -Via Fillungo, visit the Roman amphitheater, and climb the mysterious Torre Guinigi.



~Breakfast and a late Dinner at your hotel

Additional time in the afternoon for strolling the city, shopping, bike rides and sightseeing. There is no better way to end this glorious day in Lucca than by attending a wonderful concert of Puccini Arias. Many travelers say the concert is one of the highlights of their Tuscany experience.

****Optional Lunch:** Join us for lunch at Lucca's most famous restaurant "La Buca di Sant'Antonio" a Michelin Star Rated dining experience.

Gourmet Restaurant (the restaurant dates back at least to the 1700s and is one of the oldest in Italy).

****Highly recommended Queen Elizabeth, royalty, world politicians, and the world's rich and famous dine here. Traditional Lucchese 7 course lunch including Lucchese wines and bottled water, coffee, tax, and tip. € 70. (Collected at our orientation meeting in Tuscany.)**

Day 3: June 7, 2026: Volterra and San Gimignano. Full day excursion to Volterra and San Gimignano: Volterra is famous for its Etruscan roots and its beautiful alabaster. We visit this ancient Etruscan town whose original walls still stand, and explore the historical downtown with the Priori Palace, the Duomo or you can visit the Guarnacci Museum on your own.

Continue to San Gimignano, one of the most charming towns in the heart of the Tuscan region rich in works of art, good shops and with a formidable gastronomic tradition. San Gimignano is famous for its towers and amazing frescoed church of San Gimignano. It is also



famous for excellent white wine called Vernaccia di San Gimignano, saffron, honey and wild boar called "cinghiale".

Lunch is on your own, or by special arrangement your tour manager can reserve a special lunch with wild boar pasta and the wonderful Vernaccia di San Gimignano wine at a local trattoria.

Time at leisure to shop and sightsee or climb up to the top of one the towers! ~Breakfast and Dinner at your hotel.

Day 4: June 08, 2026, Collodi, Gargnano, Vinci: Today we start by discovering some wonderful Tuscan



hill towns near our hotel. Starting with a drive through the tiny hamlet of Collodi where Pinocchio was "born". We visit a town which is virtually unknown to the outside world called Gargnano, with a stop at "l'Albero delle Streghe" (The witches' tree) Next, we drive to Leonardo da Vinci's hometown. We go through some of Tuscany's magnificent countryside and see a part of Italy seldom seen by tourists. We have arranged your visit to the Leonardo Da Vinci Museum. Today's visit to Vinci also takes us to a beautiful hillside "azienda agricola" (agricultural estate) where we will sample the estate's

own organic wines and olive oil and enjoy a fabulous homemade farmhouse lunch prepared by the owner and his wife! This is Tuscan living at its best! ~Breakfast & Dinner at your hotel.



Day 5: June 09, 2026, Firenze: A full day excursion to Tuscany's Capitol city of Florence: In Florence we will meet our local guide to visit the famous Accademia Art Gallery which was founded in 1563 and was the first school in Europe to teach the techniques of drawing, painting and sculpture. The highlights of this museum are Michelangelo's colossal David and the Four Prisoners. We will pass by Dante's home and stroll the streets where he walked.

Discover the Cathedral of St. Mary of the Lily Flower, considered one of most impressive examples of Italian Gothic Style, the Campanile, also called Giotto's Bell Tower and the baptistery with the "Gate of Paradise" by Lorenzo Ghiberti. Visit the elegant Signoria Square with the Public Palace and the Loggia Del Lanzi, which is a real open-air museum of marble and bronze statues. Magnificent day in Florence continues with a glance at the Uffizi Palace and a stroll over Ponte Vecchio (old bridge famous for sumptuous gold shops).

The last stop of our unforgettable tour is the Holy Cross Church considered the Pantheon of Florence, with its monumental tombs of famous artists such as Michelangelo, Galileo, Machiavelli, and others. We will enjoy a breathtaking view of Florence from the Piazzale Michelangelo and say "arrivederci" to Florence. ~ Breakfast & Dinner at your hotel.

Day 6: June 10, 2026, Siena, and the Chianti Wine Road: After breakfast, depart for **Full day excursion to Siena and the Chianti wine road.** On our way we will stop for a visit at the solemn yet beautiful



Florence American Cemetery and Memorial site. As legend has it, Senus, Remus's son, founded Siena. Remus was one of the legendary founders of Rome along with his twin brother Romulus. Siena is a city of remarkable color. During the famous Palio Siena's 17 *contrade* (medieval guilds) proudly display their colorful flags. Everywhere you look Siena's gorgeous colors will reveal themselves. Even the color "Sienna" takes its name from this brilliant city. Crayola named a crayon and Toyota named a car after this city. We will admire the famous Piazza del Campo, Siena's bowl like shaped piazza and the zebra striped marble cathedral. We

will see the public palace with the Mangia Tower, which is one of the tallest medieval Italian towers.

We will visit Siena's great cathedral begun in the 12th century in the Romanesque style but transformed in the 13th century into one of the finest examples of Italian Gothic. The church's interior is covered with black and white marble, and its marble floors have decorative inlays by Domenico Beccafumi, treasures by Nicola Pisano and Michelangelo, painted frescoes by Pinturicchio, a magnificent baptismal font by Jacopo della Quercia, Donatello, and Lorenzo Ghiberti all make this one of the world's most thrilling cathedrals! Lunch on your own. Siena is famous for its delicious Panforte and delicate Ricciarelli almond cookies. Enjoy! ~Breakfast & Dinner at hotel

Day 7: June 11, 2026: Viareggio and Pisa: Today we will head for the famous resort town of Viareggio on the Versilian coast the Tuscan Riviera. Today is market day so bargain hunters can find many "treasures". If shopping isn't your cup of tea, you might prefer to walk along the Mediterranean Sea, or to sit in a café on the boardwalk. Next, we head to Pisa with the Fantastic

"*Campo Dei Miracoli*", the Baptistery and the Cathedral and the world-famous Leaning Tower. We will visit the inside of the famous Cattedrale Metropolitana Primaziale di Santa Maria Assunta, - the Duomo of Pisa. (Your tour manager will assist those travelers wishing to climb the tower's 296 steps, must request tickets in advance. Your tour manager will reserve and purchase the tickets for you. Cost is 25 euros per person and are limited to availability. Lunch is on your own. ~Breakfast & Dinner at your hotel



Day 8: June 12, 2026: Porto Venere and Le Cinque Terre, Liguria

After an early breakfast we will depart by private motor coach for the coastal city of **La Spezia** which is in the region of Liguria, just northwest of Tuscany. From La Spezia we will board a ferry boat to visit **Potrovenere** and the charming villages of **Le Cinque Terre**. I have always loved this area and I want to have you approach it by sea. We will begin with a visit to **Potrovenere** the most southern village, it



is spectacular with its beautiful Church of San Pietro and fortress. Next, we visit charming Vernazza with its tiny port and stone arches, it is considered by many to be the most beautiful of the villages. Then we visit Monterosso al Mare, best known for its lovely beaches and scenic charm. You will have time to shop, sightsee and enjoy the culinary delights of this region, like pesto, focaccia, and exceptional seafood. After our special day on the Ligurian Riviera, we will return to La Spezia where our driver will be waiting to take us back to the Villa delle Rose for dinner and a relaxing evening.



Day 9: June 13, 2026: Carrara Marble Mountains: Colonnata, is an ancient hilltop hamlet in the comune of Carrara. The most exquisite and prized marble called Calacatta comes from these stunning mountains. People have been quarrying its beautiful white marble since 40BC and unbelievably there's still marble left! Colonnata is nestled in the Apuan Alps with incredible views of the sea and the valley below called the Versilia. We will tour these mountains with our private local guide and learn about the excavation process. Foodies will recognize the name Colonnata, not only the white marble, but also for the pork fat delicacy called Lardo di Colonnata. We will have the opportunity to taste this creamy, delicious treat. Lunch at a tiny trattoria with wine. Return to Villa delle Rose to prepare for our departure and enjoy a luscious Farewell Dinner.

Day 10: June 14, 2026: Departure: For those not staying independently this will be the last day in Italy. Breakfast at the hotel and your tour manager will arrange a driver and transfer to the Florence airport for the flight home.

Passports and Visas and Vaccines: Each traveler who is a U.S. citizen must possess a valid U.S. passport with an expiration date **not less than six months after the tour return date**. US citizens **may (start date has not been announced.)** need to apply for travel authorization through the European Travel Information and Authorization System (ETIAS) to enter Italy and about 30 European countries. Make sure your passport details match those in your ETIAS authorization – you will be refused boarding and entry at the border if they do not match. To apply for the ETIAS please visit <https://etias.com/etias-application>. ETIAS will be valid for three years or when your current valid passport expires (whichever comes first). Travelers of other nationalities must contact the embassy or consulate of the destination country for entrance requirements. Passport and visa information may be obtained by contacting the Travel Advisory Section of the U.S. State Department at (202) 647-5225 or www.travel.state.gov. To obtain additional medical information, travel alerts and other information contact the Centers for Disease Control at (404) 332-4559 or www.cdc.gov. [ETIAS is currently not in operation and no applications are collected at this point. It is due to start 6 months after EES.](#) Children under 18 and Adults over 70 still need to apply but may be exempt from the application fee.

Traveler Notice: Walking, climbing stairs and inclines is required and is an important part of experiencing this tour. Travelers cannot require special mobility care. Travelers' mutual enjoyment of the tour requires no egregious, disruptive behavior. After first notice of such behavior, a second notice will be grounds to excuse the traveler from the remainder of the tour with no refund or credit.

Balance of Tour Fees: To secure a reservation for the tour, the traveler shall make a **non-refundable initial deposit of \$500 per person**. Deposit payment shall be payable to Ships and Trips Travel by check. ***All credit card payments are subject to a 4% charge. No fees are charged for payments by check or debit card.**
